Malaysia Airlines and Boeing signed a Memorandum of Understanding at a ceremony March 4 unveiling the first of fifteen 777s ordered by the airline last year. He added, "The 777-200X is a magnificent airplane which builds upon the commonality of our current 777 fleet yet extends the range and comfort of our service to allow any destination in the world to be linked to Kuala Lumpur non-stop.
