The Next-Generation 737 is the most environmentally friendly jetliner in its class. The Next-Generation 737 family -- the 737-600/-700/-800/-900 models -- is designed to fly higher, faster, farther and quieter than previous 737 models and continues to be the fastest-selling jetliner model in history. The 737 family has captured nearly 4,000 orders -- more than the company's biggest rival has won for its entire product line.

The Next-Generation 737s build on the strengths that have made the 737 the world's most successful commercial airplane while incorporating improvements designed for the 21st century.

The 737-800 models are powered by new CFM56-7 engines produced by CFMI, a 50/50 joint company between General Electric of the U.S. and Snecma of France. The CFM56-7 has a 10-percent higher thrust capability than the CFM56-3C engines powering the classic 737-300/-400/-500 models.
