Boeing Selects Vice President for EELV/Delta IV Program

Boeing appointed Mike Kennedy to the newly created position of vice president for the Boeing Evolved Expendable Launch Vehicle (EELV) and Delta IV programs Wednesday.

Kennedy previously was the vice president for Delta III and demonstrated his ability to manage launch vehicle development effectively by bringing Delta III on line for its first launch this summer.

Collins joined the company in 1990 and the Delta III team in 1996. Prior to that he worked on the International Space Station.

Witzling has been with the company since 1972. He has worked on the Spartan, Delta and Space Station programs in positions of increasing responsibility. In 1996 he was promoted to director of Delta II and Titan programs.
