Barber to Lead Boeing Operations in Israel

The Boeing Company has announced that Avraham "Avi" Barber, 52, has been named Country Director for Boeing in Israel.

Barber, a retired brigadier general with the Israel Defense Forces, will be in charge of Boeing operations in Israel. He will be responsible for working with Israeli defense, aviation and other government officials, as well as maintaining relationships with Israel's aerospace industry.

He has a master's degree of public administration from Harvard University and has attended the U.S. Air Force Air War College. He also has a bachelor's degree in general studies from Auburn University and a masters degree in international affairs from the University of Haifa.

Barber served as the Air Attache at the Embassy of Israel in Washington, D.C., in 1996.
