Boeing Names Representative to Rainbow/PUSH Coalition

The Boeing Company today announced that Rosalind Crenshaw, supplier diversity specialist in the Supplier Management organization at the company's Tulsa operation, has been appointed company liaison to The Rainbow/PUSH Coalition Advisory Steering Committee.

"Ros will not only represent the Boeing viewpoint to the Coalition, she'll bring back ideas and best practices from the group," said Jim Albaugh, president of Boeing Space and Communications Group and the company's socioeconomic advisor. "It's definitely a two-way process that we believe will be highly beneficial to both the Coalition and Boeing."

A 20-year Boeing employee, Crenshaw has been in the Supplier Management organization for the past two years, seeking to provide maximum opportunities for minority-owned, woman-owned and small businesses to compete in the Boeing procurement process, particularly at the Tulsa operation. Prior to that assignment, she was in production control on the B-1B program and also served as administrative assistant in the plant's executive offices.

The Rainbow/PUSH Coalition is a multiracial, multi-issue, international membership organization that seeks to move the nation and the world toward social, racial and economic justice. The Coalition was founded by Rev. Jesse L. Jackson Sr. in 1996 with the merger of Operation PUSH (founded in 1971) and the national Rainbow Coalition (1985).
