

Boeing Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Confirm Expanded Relationship

The Boeing Company and Mitsubishi Heavy Industries, Ltd. (MHI) today confirmed the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding to expand their broad cooperative relationship covering aerospace and other business areas. Boeing and MHI have been working closely together for more than 30 years, and this agreement extends that long and mutually beneficial relationship.

In recent months, Boeing and MHI have cooperated in developing programs for space businesses, such as the announcement of a joint effort to design and develop a new upper-stage propulsion system, designated the MB-XX.
