Boeing Airplane Services Names New Executive for Operations and Sales

The Boeing Company announced today that two new executives have joined the Boeing Airplane Services management team. Mark Owen has been named vice president of Operations, and Robert Avery has been named vice president of Solution Sales. The two will report to Joseph Gullion, president of Boeing Airplane Services.

As vice president of Operations, Owen will oversee the integration of Boeing Airplane Services' diverse portfolio of products and services. This includes spare parts sales, engineering services, maintenance, and commercial airplane conversions. He also serves as Gullion's chief deputy.

Prior to his current assignment, Avery spent 32 years at BFGoodrich, chiefly in management positions. His most recent assignment was president of the company's maintenance, repair and overhaul group. His duties included profit and loss responsibility for four divisions with a total of 4,000 employees located at 18 repair stations, including three facilities in Europe and three in the Far East.
