The National Merit scholars, all sons and daughters of Boeing St. Louis employees, were each awarded a scholarship of \$1,500 a year for four years at their chosen college or university.

Students qualify to become National Merit scholars based on their academic records and test scores on the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test). Selections also are based on recommendations by school officials about a student's extracurricular activities, interests and goals. About 1.2 million high school students in the United States take the PSAT annually, and only 14,000 become National Merit finalists.

Nationally, Boeing awarded scholarships to 60 high school graduates from Arizona, California, Florida, Kansas, Missouri, Maryland, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas, Utah and Washington.
