

Boeing Names Communications Vice President for New Business Unit

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The Boeing Company today announced the promotion of Sherry Nebel, 46, to vice president, Communications, for the company's recently announced new business unit, Connexion by BoeingSM. The appointment was made by Scott Carson, Boeing senior vice president and president of Connexion by Boeing, and Judith Muhlberg, vice president of Communications for The Boeing Company.
