Boeing Awarded National Guard, Reservist Support Honor

President George W. Bush today, at a White House ceremony, recognized The Boeing Company for its support of its National Guard and Reservist employees, and highlighted the company as a recipient of the 2001 Employer Support Freedom Award.

Earlier today, Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness Dr. David S. C. Chu awarded Boeing and four other companies the Freedom Award at a ceremony held at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Rudy de Leon, senior vice president of Washington, D.C., Operations, accepted the award for Boeing.

Boeing received the award for standardizing policies and procedures dealing with military duty for reservists and for creating programs to facilitate communications between reservists and their supervisors.
