Boeing Subcontractor Named NASA's Minority Subcontractor of the Year

GB Tech, Inc., a key Boeing subcontractor for the International Space Station, or ISS, has been recognized by NASA as its 2002 Minority Sub-Contractor of the Year. The honor is NASA's highest award presented to a Small Disadvantaged Business and Minority Business Enterprise.

During special presentations in Washington, D.C., Gale Burkett, GB Tech President and CEO, explained the significance of this honor along with his company's partnership with The Boeing Company [NYSE:BA].

"We are honored to be recognized by NASA for our role on the International Space Station," Burkett said.
