In April 2002, Boeing significantly increased its presence in Spain with the appointment of Pedro Arguelles as president of Boeing Spain.

- Spanish airlines operate approximately 150 Boeing aircraft, representing more than 50 percent of aircraft flown by Spanish airlines.
- Spain's military forces fly Boeing aircraft, including the EF-18 Hornet, the AV-8B Harrier II Plus and the CH-47D Chinook.
- Alteon, Boeing's flight training enterprise formerly known as Flight Safety Boeing Training International, operates one of its five European centers at Palma de Mallorca.
