Boeing F-15T Short-Listed For Singapore

The Government of Singapore has selected the Boeing [NYSE:BA] F-15T Strike Eagle as one of three aircraft in the short-list of platforms to be evaluated in the Invitation to Tender phase of Singapore's Next Fighter Replacement Program.

The Boeing F-15T Strike Eagle was among six fighter aircraft under consideration.

"Boeing respects the thorough and comprehensive nature of the evaluation and selection criteria, and we are pleased and honored that Singapore has selected the F-15T Strike Eagle," said Doug Miller, vice president of Business Development, Asia Pacific, for Boeing Integrated Defense Systems.
