Boeing to Integrate Communications Systems Upgrades for New Zealand's 757s

The New Zealand Ministry of Defence has awarded Boeing (NYSE:BA) a \$11.2 million contract to develop and integrate upgrades to the communications systems of the country's two Boeing 757 multi-mission military aircraft.

"These upgrades will allow New Zealand to operate their aircraft more effectively in the multi-mission role by providing reliable and secure communications," said Pat Finneran, vice president and general manager of Boeing's Logistics Support Systems.

The upgrades are part of a program that will equip the two aircraft for multi-mission capabilities including: troop transport, aero-medical evacuation, VIP transportation and international humanitarian aid missions.

Boeing will design, develop and produce communications system upgrade kits at its Development and Modification Center in Wichita, Kan. The kits will be installed in the B-757 aircraft by Mobile Aerospace Engineering in Alabama in conjunction with other aircraft upgrade work being accomplished at that facility. Boeing will provide support for installation, test and certification of the upgrade kits.
