John Duddy is appointed vice president and managing director of Boeing Defence Australia effective Dec. 8, 2008.

In that role, he was responsible for executing U.S. government contracts to develop and deploy GPS satellites, as well as sustainment contracts for U.S. legacy satellite systems.

Duddy is a Georgia Institute of Technology industrial engineering graduate and currently serves on the institute's Industry Advisory Board for the School of Materials Science and Engineering.
