

Boeing Appoints Bruni Communications Director for Italy and Southern Europe

ROME, March 30, 2009 -- Boeing [NYSE: BA] has appointed Marcello Bruni as director of corporate communications for Italy and Southern Europe. Bruni, 40, succeeds Antonio De Palmas, who had been appointed president of European Union and NATO Relations. Bruni will be responsible for developing the company's communications strategies and engaging with key stakeholders in Italy, Greece and the Balkans.

He obtained a masters degree in European Studies from the London School of Economics and Political Science.

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
