Boeing to Highlight Integrated, Affordable Solutions at AFA Air & Space Conference

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9, 2009 -- The Boeing Company [NYSE: BA], at next week's U.S. Air Force Association Air & Space Conference and Technology Exposition, will highlight a range of affordable solutions for the Air Force that include both comprehensive support and network-centric operations. The conference will take place Sept. 14-16 at the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center at National Harbor, Md., near Washington.

"The Air Force's top leadership will be at the conference to discuss the pressing issues and challenges facing the United States, its warfighters and the aerospace community," said Steve Gress, Boeing Government Operations vice president of Air Force Systems. "Boeing will be there to listen to our valued customer and to show how our innovative, integrated products and services can affordably meet the Air Force's needs, now and in the future.
