

Boeing Names Tim Peters to Lead Surveillance and Engagement Division

Appointment supports company's growth in airborne intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance market

KENT, Wash., Aug. 30, 2011 -- The Boeing Company [NYSE: BA] today named Tim Peters vice president and general manager of Surveillance and Engagement, a division of Boeing Defense, Space & Security's Boeing Military Aircraft unit. Peters succeeds Bob Feldmann, who has accepted a post at Boeing Commercial Airplanes to lead the effort to develop the 737 MAX.

In his new position, Peters is responsible for ensuring delivery of the Airborne Early Warning and Control and P-8 programs, and for developing and expanding Surveillance and Engagement capabilities in the United States and internationally. He will be based in Kent.

"Tim is a high-performing executive who has shown an ability to manage through times of rapid change and unexpected challenges in a tough competitive landscape," said Chris Chadwick, president of Boeing Military Aircraft.
