Recent Boeing acquisition Solutions Made Simple Inc. receives 1st civil government contract for Twister Data Framework

Under the terms of the agreement, SMSi will provide software licenses and support for its Twister Data Framework technology to the SEC as part of the agency's effort to better access and manage data stored across its enterprise.
