The ratings provide insight into a company's ability to execute on proposed projects, thereby reducing risk and required oversight by the customer.

The certification process for the Boeing Huntsville site was conducted by independent auditor American Systems and included an extensive review and analysis of development processes, documentation, measurement systems and quality assurance tools used by the Ground-based Midcourse Defense and International Space Station programs.

"This achievement is the culmination of years of hard work and discipline, demonstrating that Boeing Huntsville employees are committed to the highest standards of business operations in delivering quality products and solutions," Jones said.
