Medal of Honor recipient and retired Army Captain joins Boeing Government Operations team

After rising in the ranks following progressively more challenging assignments, Groberg was promoted to the rank of Army captain in July 2012.

Groberg holds a bachelor's degree in criminology and criminal justice from the University of Maryland, College Park.

In addition to the Medal of Honor, Captain Groberg's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal with one Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster; the Purple Heart; the Meritorious Service Medal; the Army Commendation Medal; the Army Achievement Medal with one Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster; the Afghanistan Campaign Medal with three Bronze Service Stars; the Global War on Terrorism Medal; the National Defense Service Medal; the Army Service Ribbon; the Overseas Service Ribbon; the NATO Medal; the Combat Infantryman Badge; the U.S. Army Parachutists Badge; the U.S. Army Ranger Tab; and the Meritorious Unit Commendation.
