The Scouts help transitioning service members identify personal and professional goals while connecting them to the resources necessary for a successful transition into the civilian workforce.

"We are proud to once again partner with Boeing to provide best-in-class transition services to service members and their families. This generous contribution from Boeing will help the USO offer the highest quality of transition services to meet the broadest spectrum of needs."
