

Boeing Donates \$100,000 for Flooding Relief in South Carolina

North Charleston, S.C., Oct. 8, 2015 – Boeing (NYSE: BA) announced today it is donating \$100,000 to provide immediate aid and relief to victims of the widespread flooding across South Carolina. Relief efforts are expected to continue across the state for an extended period as communities work to recover, with the full extent of the destruction caused by flooding yet to be determined.
