Boeing Contributes \$100,000 to Support Tornado Recovery and Relief Efforts in Missouri

Boeing's generous contribution of \$100,000 at a time when people need hope like never before will make it possible to provide gift cards to hundreds of survivors throughout St. Louis County in communities where Boeing employees live and work."

In addition to corporate charitable investments, Boeing employees give to their local communities through their local Boeing Employees Community Fund chapter and by participating in volunteer and charitable gift match programs. Consistent with Boeing employee gift match programs, the company will match qualifying employee contributions made in support of tornado relief efforts.

Disaster recovery and relief efforts align with Boeing's ongoing commitment to the communities where the company has a presence. Boeing employs more than 17,000 people in Missouri, and in 2024, contributed over \$12 million in charitable investments across the state.
